Further to your letter dated 25th February 2010 I write to you on behalf of our Chairman, Mr Barry Hearn.

We have reviewed your request for the nomination for a World Snooker Tour place for the African Snooker Champion. We are unable to grant you this request for the forthcoming season. World Snooker is committed to development of the sport internationally and as such we will continue to review your request for future years.

We would like to invite the African Snooker Champion a place at the forthcoming World Open tournament. The new World Open will see the 96 Professional players and 32 Amateur players compete in for the first time in a World Snooker ranking event.

Your candidate will compete in the qualifying rounds of the World Open in a field of 128 players taking place 21st – 24th August 2010 at the World Snooker Academy in Sheffield, UK. Should your nominee be successful they will then take part in the final televised rounds of the tournament taking place 18th-26th September 2010. The final rounds will be televised live on BBC, Eurosport, CCTV 5 and other international broadcasters.

All costs associated with competing in the World Open will be the responsibility of the player and we will send you further details shortly.

Thank you for your invitation for a World Snooker representative to attend the forthcoming African Snooker Championship. Unfortunately, our busy schedule at the moment does not permit World



Snooker to send a representative to the event. We would however welcome a full report and photographs from the Championship so that we can report this on Worldsnooker.com.

We wish you great success in this year's Championship and we hope you can join your player in Sheffield for the World Open.
